There have been reports recently of police investigations into the misuse of social networking platforms, specifically regarding children being persuaded to 'friend' and interact with individuals who then act inappropriately towards them. This is just a reminder to parents and carers of the need to closely monitor your children's internet activities, in particular their use of the latest apps, websites and games.

We tell our children to share but online it's different. In fact, sometimes sharing online can be dangerous. Talking to your child is the best way to help keep them safe. I am sad to be writing that our school has been suffering lately with some acts of theft and vandalism occurring on our school site during the evenings and at weekends. Some items have been taken from our Early Years garden; our Nursery window was broken earlier this week; someone tried to set our school sign on fire and the roof of our bicycle shed had been damaged. The police have been informed on each occasion and have filed the relevant reports. Our school is the hub and heart of our community. It is a place where children, adults and staff should feel safe at all times and of course, many people have attended our school with their children and their children's children spending the first years of their education here, evoking happy memories that will stay with them their whole lives. Every theft or act of vandalism means that money from our budget has to be spent on the repair. It also means that valuable time is spent by school staff photographing the damage and writing up reports and other paperwork, instead of spending their time on more productive tasks. You will remember that we now no longer have rabbits on our site for the children to enjoy due to these same acts of cruel vandalism last year. I don't understand why anyone would want to do this or be associated with it. I would ask as a community that we are all as vigilant as possible and if you see anyone trying to access our site out of hours please let the relevant authorities or the school know. Thank you.
