Parents Evening and Feedback Forms

A huge thank you to those parents, grandparents and carers who were able to join us for Parents' Evenings on Monday and Tuesday of this week. I hope that you found it helpful to catch up with your child's class teacher on how your child is progressing this year and that you had a chance to look through some of their wonderful work in their books. Many of those who attended kindly completed one of our Parent Feedback Forms which is very much appreciated. This time, we received the largest number of responses we have ever had. At the time of writing I have counted 52 responses! All are overwhelmingly positive and a couple have made constructive suggestions about how we might improve our school even further. Thank you for taking the trouble to fill them in. I have read them all personally and will be discussing any issues with the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) here in school. Either myself or a member of the SLT will respond personally to any queries you may have noted. I am delighted that the feedback has all been extremely positive about our school and the teaching and learning that takes place here and any comments that have been made have been very helpful and constructive as we aim to improve wherever we can. As you know, I had planned to have an area of school set aside with some laptops to support any parents with Learning Ladders at Home, either with logging on or accessing their child's Ladders. Unfortunately, on Monday the whole of Northumberland school system lost its internet and Wi-Fi for the day and we were unable to provide this service. Please rest assured that we are happy to help where we can and if you would like some individual support in accessing the system then please don't hesitate to contact Miss Tuart or myself.

Be Safe Initiative

I have arranged for a visiting professional to work initially with some of our older children for an hour in school over the coming weeks. The focus will be on Anti-Bullying Awareness and has been developed to educate young people on how to recognise various forms of bullying and how best to deal with it, should it occur. You will know that school already has measures in place to tackle this such as our Behaviour Management programme, Rainbow Station, Bubble Time and the work Mrs Johnston and Mrs Rozgowska carry out with children and families. These workshops are an additional tool to support children in making the right choices around friendships, exploring what bullying means and what it looks like and informing them how to stand up to it and deal with any situation that may arise.

The gentleman delivering the courses has worked with many schools in the area including Stead Lane and comes highly recommended. As his diary is already quite full I have booked up three sessions for the following Year Groups:

Friday 24th March – Year 5 – 1.10 – 2.10pm

Monday 3rd April – Year 4 – 1.10 – 2.10pm

Monday 15th May – Year 6 – 1.10 – 2.10pm

The lessons are differentiated slightly in content depending on the age to ensure they are appropriate. I think they will be very valuable for the children as they enhance and augment our PSHE and reinforce some of the messages that we have been giving to the children through this academic year. My aim is then to tailor some of these workshops for some of our younger children so that they are able to hear a similar, age-appropriate message.

We have also designed some brand new posters and flyers which will be distributed around school to help support children should they face friendship issues in the future. If you have any questions about this provision, please don't hesitate to contact me. Thank you.
