Dropping Off and Collecting Children

I understand that, particularly for some parents who are dropping off and/or collecting children by car, these times of the day can be difficult and at times, stressful. Some of the streets around the school are narrow and can already be congested with traffic when you arrive, not just from our school but also the local shops and businesses. Can I please ask that you take extra care when dropping off or collecting your children and please encourage them to walk on the pavements and look carefully when crossing the roads? Can I also respectfully ask car drivers to make sure that they do not block local residents' driveways and access points when they arrive at school and to park responsibly, making sure that they are not blocking the pavements, thereby possibly forcing pedestrians onto the road. I know that you will all join with me in wishing to ensure that all our children and adults can arrive at and leave our school safely. Thank you very much for your co-operation.

School Meal Survey

Once again, thank you to everyone who has returned the survey about school meals that I sent home before the holidays. In total, I received 33 surveys back into school and have read each one personally. Your views have been noted and have been shared with the Senior Leadership Team here as well as representatives from the Local Authority. I really appreciate the constructive nature of your views and many of you have been very positive about our current provision. I recognise, however, that there is always room for improvement. You have shared your thoughts on: portion sizes; choice of meals; the balance of pasta and rice dishes; more traditional choices of meals; the importance of a nutritional hot meal, especially on a cold day and the balance of particular food groups on a plate. We are also consulting with the children in classrooms as to their thoughts about lunchtimes as we formulate the launch of our new menus in the next few weeks.
