A warm welcome back to all children, parents and carers after the half-term holiday. I hope that you all had a wonderful week and were able to spend some quality time with family and friends. It is lovely to see everyone back again, refreshed and ready for the last half term of the academic year. Time has passed so quickly and we have a lot of activities to pack in to the last 7 weeks of the term.

We started the week with our invitation to parents and carers to come into school for a mathematics workshop with their child followed by lunch from our new summer menu. Those who were able to join us seemed to really enjoy the opportunity to come into school and share these experiences with their child. I had a lot of positive comments from the parents I spoke to as well as some helpful and constructive comments as to how we might improve the experience next time. My aim will certainly be to have a longer and perhaps more in-depth curriculum session, be this for mathematics or English, and ensure this is focused particularly on year groups as far as possible.
