Welcome Back

A warm welcome back to all our children and families after the Christmas break. I hope that you all had a wonderful break and found some time to relax with family and friends. At our whole-school assembly on Tuesday morning I spoke to the children a little about my own experiences over the Christmas break and how nice it was to have some time to reconnect a little with our families. We live in such a frenetic world that sometimes, if we can, it is good to be able to take stock of what we have and reflect a little. However you spent your holiday, I hope that you had a wonderful time.

Assessing your Child

As always, we hit the ground running here at Bedlington Station. Teaching staff attended training on Monday where we were looking at how we assess children and we spent time evaluating different pieces of anonymised children's work across our Partnership. You may know from our recent Parents' Evenings, or have read, that children will no longer be assessed using "levels" i.e. level 2 or level 4. Instead, each school has been tasked to develop its own system which looks at the breadth and depth of knowledge a child has, rather than aiming to move up through levels as quickly as possible. We have developed a robust system which we are happy with and we will be sending home an information leaflet in the next couple of weeks to explain this system to you and what it will mean for you and your child. I would stress that there is nothing to worry about and if you have any questions you will be able to speak to your class teacher. If there is the demand I will be happy to put on a brief information session for parents after school one day to go through things in a little more detail and for you to ask any questions you may have. One of the real benefits of our assessment system will be that you and your child will be able to log on to the system at home to see exactly what they can do, where further development is needed and with the added bonus of being able to see actual pieces of work created by your child on-line. Naturally, you will only be able to see your child's work and everything will be password protected. Look out for more information being sent home and on our website in the next few weeks.

Creative Project - Station Studios

You will all have received a letter before the Christmas break and again today about our new Creative Project which begins next Monday. In amongst all the information, I would draw your particular attention to the section on what the children will be wearing for the project. We have listened to your constructive comments about last year's project in respect of the school being "non uniform" for the entire project (i.e. 5 weeks), which can be difficult to manage and I hope that you consider our proposal of school shoes and normal uniform skirt or trousers with a coloured T Shirt provided free of charge by school as an acceptable compromise. Thank you for your support of our creative projects and I know the next one will be an amazing success and the best ever!
